13.04 (ii) k. any notification from any insurer that the Member has been delisted as a provider.	New	<p>There are situations where an insurance company delists members of this College without notifying the College and going through the formal complaints process. This information is relevant to the College, and it is important that this information be provided to us.</p> <p>In 2020, the College recommended an addition that requires members to notify the College if they are delisted by an insurance company.</p>
